The Beginning - Genesis 1:1, 2

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. 2The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the waters.

John 1:1

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

John 1:2

He was with God in the beginning.

Acts 17:24

"The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands.

God made everything in this world. Think about it. Everything that was ever made in this world and will be made is made from the things that were put here by God. The Creator of the universe, who is supernatural and not of this world, does not reside in buildings built by human hands.

Hebrews 1:10

Hebrews 11:3
